



Dear friends,

In the parable of the sheep and the goats from Matthew 25 that David Norse preached from recently, Jesus weaves a story about this weird barnyard scene: there's a king trying his best to keep the sheep from running amuck with the goats. After separating them (and washing his hands one hopes) the king tells them the sheep have been good and the goats...well, not so good. Why? Because when the sheep saw him, they helped him out, and when the goats saw him they ignored him. Yet both sets of animals protest they never saw the king: "But Lord, when was it we saw you hungry and gave you food, thirsty and gave you something to drink? When was it we saw you a stranger and welcomed you, or naked and gave you clothing? And when was it that we saw you sick or in prison and visited you?" And Jesus gives us the king's chilling reply: "Truly I tell you, just as you did it to the least of these who are members of my family, you did it to me."

One of the truest things I've ever heard about the church came from Dick Ray, the former President of the Board of Directors of the Presbyterian Outlook. He said in a meeting once: "Stewardship can never be confused with fundraising, nor outreach with marketing." Dick's point? In the church our goal, our chief end, is never ourselves- it is God. We don't raise money simply to have a bigger budget. We don't grow the congregation simply to look more impressive. Indeed, especially when it comes to outreach, we invite friends to visit our congregation NOT primarily to bring them to God- we invite friends to church in the trust that they

are bringing the presence of Christ with them and we don't want to miss out.

Folks, in this upcoming February as part of celebrating TPC's 25th Anniversary we are inviting and welcoming different friends into our congregation. On the 4th we will celebrate our Scouts, as we do every year. Two scout troops currently use TPC's facilities, and over the years these scouts have given this congregation of their time, talent, and hard work. On February 18th we are celebrating Tualatin Valley Preschool, who meets downstairs throughout the school year. We are so pleased TVP is part of this community and simply want to give thanks for their presence with us over the years. And then finally, on February 25th, we will celebrate our Tuesday's Treasures. Again, we are thankful for the James Goodpasture Award for ministry with special populations this ministry received from Union-PSCE. We are thankful for these special people and the ways in which they reveal God.

I'm looking forward to February and I hope you are, too. And if you see someone you don't know- please don't avoid them thinking you don't want to be embarrassed because you don't know their name. Just smile, stick out your hand, and say, "Good morning. Welcome to TPC."

December was a very exciting and busy month. Thanks to the generosity of the TPC family and friends, gifts and food baskets were provided for two families; a total of nine children and three adults. In addition, the five residents of the 89th Court Home were surprised with both personal gifts and some items for the home such as comforters and kitchen linens. All of the recipients expressed their gratitude for your kindness and caring.

172 individual items including scarves, mittens, socks and hats were provided for the Janus project for homeless youth. In addition, on Wednesday, Dec. 27th, TCP members provided dinner for 16 volunteer medical personnel serving at the Uninsured Medical Clinic in Tigard.

\$1,610.00 was given to the Food Pantry and \$600.00 to Northwest Medical Teams as Christmas Memorial gifts. The Christmas Eve offering was designated for the Oregon Donor program and \$755.00 was contributed to that cause.

The Crall's living room was home to our congregation for our first six weeks of worship. Why? Because the Cralls had 3 small kids, a piano and not a lot of other furniture, giving Thom Nelson the idea that their house would be a good place to get started. On Sunday morning, the Cralls would get up, feed 3 young kids, clean up for church (literally), and have all the dishes and toys put away before 10 am. The first few worship meetings, everyone faced down the hall until they realized whoever needed to use the bathroom had to walk past the 'front'. Oops. Barb assures us, however, there was no shortage of TP at TPC. Without an offering plate, Matt Crall dug through his toys and found a frisbee which was used for months and become a symbol of TPC's link to its member's everyday lives. Many young kids meant that after worship and 'coffee time', the Cralls would clean up and put away toys all over again. Even after the VFW hall was being used for worship, the Cralls continued to host Sunday School, using members' cars to drive kids to and from the VFW on Sunday mornings. One Sunday, a particularly pesky train was maneuvering back and forth, blocking the road for an extended period of time. Waiting (and waiting) at the tracks, the Sunday School leadership team held an impromptu conference and decided to sort the kids between the vans by age level. They then started lessons while waiting for the train. Thanks Cralls...TPC originals!
