First Kings Outline

Introduction: First Kings takes up where Second Samuel left off. Here we find the story of Solomon's rise to power, the building of the temple, and then the division of the kingdom upon Solomon's death. After the rebellion of Jereboam, the Bible will refer to Israel as the northern part of the kingdom that followed after Jereboam and Judah being the southern kingdom that stayed true to the Davidic line. We also see the rise of Elijah, one of the great prophets of the Bible, and a model for Jesus.

Chapter 1: David nearing death, Adonijah usurps, Solomon made king officially

Chapter 2: David's advice to Solomon, Adonijah's attempt on Abishag, Solomon's consolidation of power- killing Joab, Abiathar, and Shimei

Chapter 14: J's son Abijah sick; wife in disguise goes to Ahijah for healing; Jereboam condemned; Jereboam and Rehoboam die

Chapter 15: Abijah succeeds Rehoboam (J); Asa succeeds Abijah (J); Nadab succeeds Jereboam (I); and Baasha assassinates Nabab (I)

Chapter 16: Jehu prophesies against Baasha; Elah succeeds Baasha but is killed by Zimri (I); Omri takes over from Zimri- Omri worse than everybody (I); then Ahab his son succeeds (I)
