

Second Corinthians Outline

Introduction: Paul's second letter to the Corinthians is kinder than the first- conceding the communities' positive response to his first letter. Things are so positive Paul's second letter here is in large part a letter asking the community for further financial support. And the warnings that do come at the end are mainly warning the community away from charismatic teachers who appear to be drawing more attention to themselves than to the good news of Christ. Some of our most memorable images from Paul come from this letter- that we are jars of clay, that we are part of a ministry of reconciliation, and the enigmatic thorn in Paul's flesh.
